What: Natural Dye Day June 23

When: Saturday June 23, 2018, 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Where: Peinhardt Living History Farm, Cullman, AL. Near southeast corner of I-65 at Exit 308. For driving directions, see peinhardtlhf.tumblr.com/directions.

Supply Fee: Option 1 = \$5, chemical fee if you're bringing up to one pound of your own fiber already mordanted, or up to one pound of wool fiber washed and ready to mordant;

Option 2 = \$15, chemical fee and about one pound of wool yarn washed and ready to mordant.

Fee to be paid to leader at the beginning of the workshop.

Pre-registration deadline: June 9.

Maximum Number: 15.

Workshop open to adults and youth ages 14 and up.

Yellow comes from flowers, leaves and onion skins. Red comes from insects. Brown comes from nuts. Use plants, trees and insects to color fibers. We're planning black walnut hulls, pecan shells, marigold blossoms, mimosa leaves, onion skins, Queen Anne's lace, cochineal, logwood, indigo and a couple of other dyes. Learn how to prepare the fiber and the dyes. At the end of the day, you'll have a rainbow of colors.

Important Information: If you are bringing your own fiber, do not bring more than one pound. Be considerate of others wanting to dye. Your fiber must be either washed wool (that you can mordant at the beginning of the day) or washed and already mordanted fiber. If you are bringing roving or unspun fleece, bring something to contain the fiber in the dyepot, such as a lingerie bag. You may mordant your fiber before the workshop. There will be a pot of mordant (alum and cream of tartar) for wool available at the workshop. If you're not bringing wool, you must mordant the fiber yourself before the *Natural Dye Day*.

Washing fiber, mordanting and how to prepare the dye pot will be explained during the workshop. To receive information on washing and mordanting your fiber before the workshop, email **HsvFiber @gmail.com**.

Dress for the weather, wear a sunhat and closed toe shoes. We will be working outside with open fires. Bring a check (payable to Huntsville Fiber Guild) or exact change for the supply fee and your sack lunch.

June 9 is World Wide Knit in Public Day. In this area, there are three celebrations.

Rocket Stitches at the Gazebo will be at the gazebo in Madison, on Front Street, 10:00 a.m. -2:00 p.m. Bring knitting, crocheting and spinning. All are welcome. Bring your lawn chairs, and there will be some seating in the gazebo. There will be drawings throughout the day. Bottled water will be provided. If there is inclement weather, the event will move into $Hook\ a\ Frog$.

Huntsville WWKIP Day will be at Flying Monkey Theater in Lowe Mill, on the second floor of the south building, 2211 Seminole Drive SW Huntsville, 11:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. Bring your projects to sit and stitch. There will be vendors, door prizes and a fashion show. There will be opportunities to learn to knit or crochet. There will be electrical outlets if you'd like to bring your own task lighting.

WWKIP will be at *Yarn Boutique of Decatur*, High Point Market, 307 2nd Avenue, 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Bring your knitting or crocheting. There will be door prizes. If the weather is inclement, we'll meet at the yarn shop across the street.

Weave a Round Basket on June 30

On Saturday June 30, 2018, 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., at Bailey Cove Library, you'll have the opportunity to make a basket. Bailey Cove Library is at 1409 Weatherly Plaza SE, Huntsville.

Weave a round basket in class. Learn how to handle round basket reed, how to start a round basket, and how to shape a basket. The finished baskets will be about 6 inches tall with a 5-inch diameter base. You can use colored reed and beads to decorate your baskets.

The supply fee is \$8, due at the beginning of the workshop. This workshop is open to adults and youth ages 14 and up. Contact the guild, HsvFiber @gmail.com, to pre-register. The maximum number of students is 12. You're welcome if you do not pre-register, but there might not be enough supplies.

Other Options: For those who know how to make a round basket, you have two options: weave a basket over a quart jar (use as a flower vase that will hold water) or weave a double-walled basket. Bring a quart jar for the flower vase.

If there is time, you can weave another basket, starting with a wooden base.

No basket making experience is required. Bring a towel (basket making is wet work) and sack lunch, and wear comfortable clothes. The instructor will bring all the tools and other supplies you'll need to use during the workshop.

Deb Menz Study Group

At the April meeting of the *Deb Menz Study Group*, we split the previously dyed fiber. Using Deb Menz's method, we picked a photograph or picture and analyzed the colors using colored pencils. We matched the colors to fiber and then layered the colors on a drum carder. We spun a small amount and then used the yarn to make knitted and woven samples. We made more batts for the May 19 *Spin-In*.
